Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

After completing the course the student should be prepared to participate in and manage the conceptual development of the project. Students are able to describe the importance of the concept and design of value creation activity in architecture and construction. Participants are also expected to have a general understanding of architectural concepts in the broader sense, and a deeper understanding of the chosen approach. Participants are also expected to be able to describe how the concept of supporting the formation of the building program in relation to client requirements and the continued development of proposals for implementation. They should also have a basic understanding of communication tools used in conceptual development.

Course contents

The course covers project development and analysis of needs, market, development rights, legal requirements, financing, design and marketing.

The course also deals with concepts related to architecture, technology, society and economy. Programs, concepts and building proposals. Design method and design expression that market advantage. Tools designed for the analysis, design and communication.
