

Examination

Forms of examination

The examination on the course consists of two parts: programming assignments (also called labs), and a closed exam. These two parts are defined thus:

- Programming assignments, 4.5 credits: ID1018 LAB1 (A/B/C/D/E/Fx/F)
- Exam, 3 credits: ID1018 TEN1 (A/B/C/D/E/Fx/F)

The whole course is 7.5 credits and the grading is (A/B/C/D/E/Fx/F) for both programming assignments and exam. In addition to the grades given for assignments and exam, a course grade is also set. This is formed from the grades of the two parts, as an average rounded upwards. For example, the part grades C and A, or A and C, give the course grade B. If the part grades are B and A, or A and B, the course grade is A..

Examination of programming assignments

Examination of the programming assignments is part of the examination on the course. The grade for the programming assignments is normally set at the end of the course, but could also take place at a later point in time. A student's grade depends on the number of assignments that have been examined and passed, like this:

- E - all mandatory assignments
- D - all mandatory assignments and any one extra assignment
- C - all mandatory assignments and two extra assignments
- B - all mandatory assignments and three extra assignments
- A - all mandatory assignments and four extra assignments

The specification of the programming assignments and a description of what to present to the examiner are found in the document "Programming Assignments".

Exam

The exam is closed, written, and given at the end of the course. In addition to the regular exam, a re-exam is given later in the academic year.
