

- Capital of Sweden
- Biggest city in Sweden

- 13,500 full-time students
- 3700 full-time employees, 305 professors (46 women, 259 men)

- Around one third of all students are from outside of Sweden

Covid-19 - KTH

A range of modifications on campus have been implemented to limit the spread of COVID-19. These adaptations are continuously monitored, and they will be modified if necessary.

- Service counters separated with plexiglass barriers
- Floor markings showing where to stand for physical distancing
- Signage informing about capacity restrictions, displayed in print and digital formats throughout campus
- Limitations on group sizes will vary according to activities and settings, for example through scheduling and planning of teaching activities
- Designated seating for physical distance in classrooms, labs and lecture halls
- Hand sanitizer dispensers in lecture rooms and all student areas
- More frequent cleaning and disinfection of interiors, including toilets, door handles and handrails

Rights and Responsibilities

Disciplinary actions may be taken against students who:

For example:

- 1. try to mislead
 - by using aids during an examination that is not allowed
 - by plagiarizing someone else's essay/homework
 - by letting someone else add their name to an attendance list, despite not being present
- 2. act in a disruptive manner at the university
- 3. subject another student or employee at the university to harassment or sexual harassment

The KTH Code of Conduct clarify some of the expectations of you as a student at KTH. In short:

- Equal treatment at KTH implies a respectful and inclusive work and study environment

Registration to courses






KTH-email under "My pages"






Temporary registration number (T-number)


