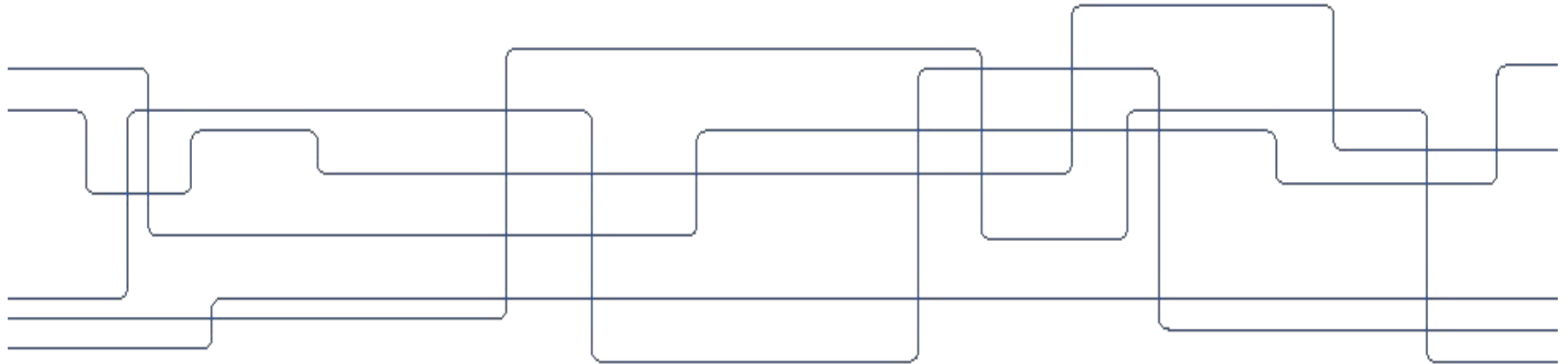
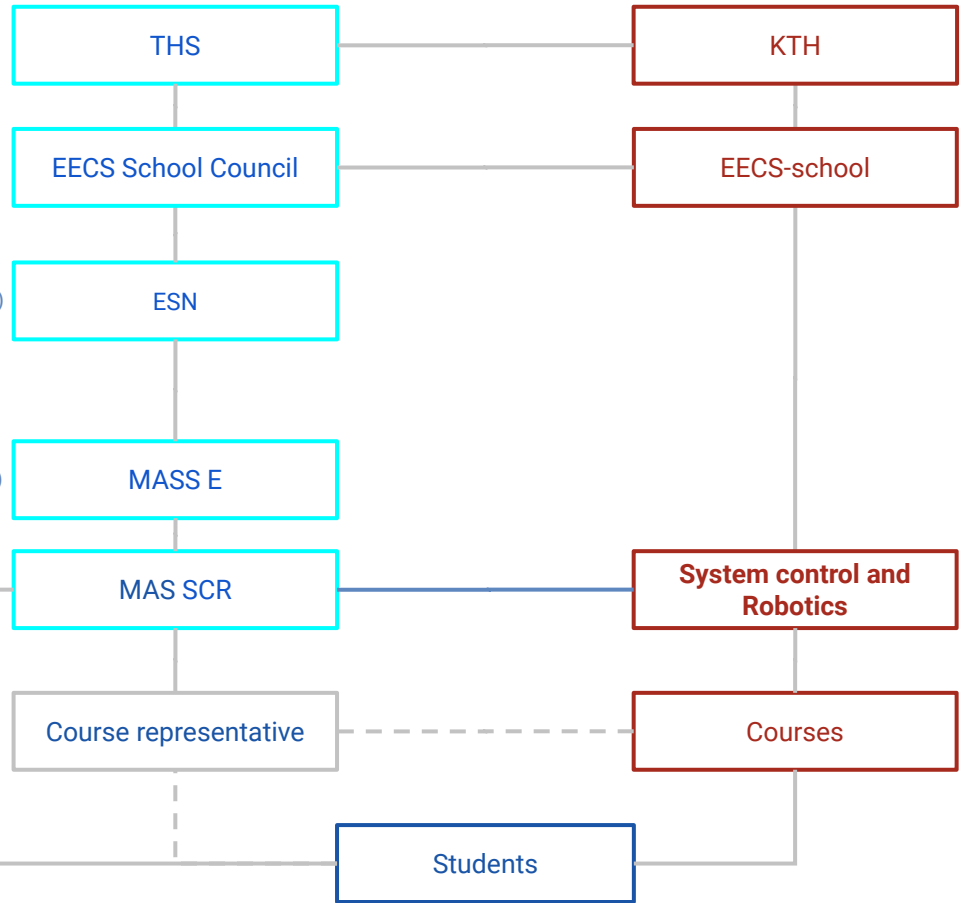

What is MAS (master student representative) ?

- Link between students and teachers, especially Programme Director (PA)
 - Helps organizing and developing the program from a students view
 - Solves problems with courses, teachers and program – if desired anonymous!
 - Collects feedback on courses each period, presents to PA/MAS councils
 - Usually 1-2 people, mixing swedish/international and first/second year students

Live in Sweden

1. If you are not from EU/Nordic union, you have to register at Migrationsverket
2. Go to the Skatteverket-event – in case there is one
 - This will give you a personal number, which is required for almost everything (like a bank account, phone contract, ...)
3. Join the student union - THS <https://ths.kth.se/en/membership>
4. Register for the housing queue (requires THS membership!):

5. Go out in nature while it's still summer – winter is coming soon and it's getting dark ;-)
6. Keep updated with the Covid-19 situation (changes may occur):

Learning Swedish

- KTH offers some Swedish courses – check out if you can take them and if they count for your degree
- Tell people and friends to talk Swedish with you, otherwise Swedish people will talk to you in English

 - At the moment online, due to the Covid-19 situation
 - Swedish is offered on Thursdays lunchtime (12-13)
 - Possibility to learn other languages as well:
 - > *Tuesday: Japanese, Spanish, Chinese, German, French, and Italian*
 - > *Thursday: Swedish and English*
- If not, English will work as well in Sweden



Living in Sweden (everyday advices)

- Take off your shoes if you enter someone's apartment
- Say “thank you” at least 154 times a day, otherwise you make a rude impression
- In Sweden, everyone is equal. There is no distinction between male/female etc
- Swedish people seem to be closed – start talking with them and they’ll turn out nice!
 - Talk about the weather, a very important topic in Sweden!
 - Work together, e.g. to learn for a course.
- The administration might seem to be ineffective and take a long time, but it will work out in the end
- Buy a SL monthly card, it’s way cheaper than single rides if you commute daily
