

# Sweden and Stockholm

#### Sweden:

- Population 10 million, 0,13 percent of the worlds population
- Constitutional monarchy with parliamentary democracy
- Varied climate and people like talking about the wheather ☺

#### Stockholm

- Capital and biggest city
- Home to 960 000 people in the city, 2,4 million in the county
- Built on 14 islands (24 000 in the archipelago)
- Around 85 000 students

- Established in 1827
- 13500 full time students
- Ranked 89 in QS-ranking (23 EE, 54 CS)

# Student Health services

- can support you if you are not feeling well and need to talk to someone. Study-related matters.
- you can meet a company nurse, psychologist and counsellor
- free of charge and the staff has the duty of confidentiality
- premises at Stockholm University.
- offer group activities and workshops.

#### **Medical care**

If you become ill and need to get in touch with regular medical care, **call 1177** (Health Care Guide) to get in touch with the national health service.

If you are in an emergency, call 112.

# Funka

If you have a documented, permanent disability, you can receive compensatory support in your studies at KTH. The group coordinating the support is called Funka. Read more about the support offered and how to apply for it at **kth.se/en/funka**.

Please note your home university is responsible for any additional costs.

#### **Examples of permanent disabilities are:**

- dyslexia
- physical disabilities
- neuropsychiatric disabilities: e.g. autism / asperger, ADHD, ADD
- permanent mental illness

#### **Examples of support are:**

- longer writing time for exams and partial exams
- help with taking notes
- resources from the KTH Library, such as audiobooks, Braille or e-textbooks.



# Safety during your studies

KTH has a security and crisis organisation working for you to feel safe during your studies. Here are some simple general tips:

- Never leave your valuables without supervision.
- Do not write your PIN code on your access card, and do not lend the card to others.
- Do not let unauthorised persons in through locked doors.
- Keep track of escape routes in case the fire alarm goes off.
   Evacuation plans are available in all buildings.
- In the evenings and nights, guards check KTH's buildings, so remember to have a valid ID or passport if you study late on KTH's premises.
- Within KTH 08-790 9900 to get in contact with security guard.
- For serious accidents first call 112 then 08-790 7700.



#### Insurance

- All students are insured via KTH on the school premises
- and during travel to and from these
- Make sure you have sufficient medical insurance coverage

# Rights and obligations

You have the right to influence your education and study situation. You can do this by, for example, filling in course evaluations or becoming active in your chapter.

On the Student Web, **kth.se/en/student**, you can find information on how to leave complaints and report wrong-doings. For example, you can:

- Submit complaints regarding your education or study environment
- Report if you have been a victim of harassment, discrimination or victimization at KTH. You can also turn to an employee you have confidence in to report.

As a student, you also have some obligations, such as:

- To avoid cheating and plagiarism
- Not to harass other students and staff

Disciplinary actions may be taken.

# Avoid cheating and plagiarism

- One example of cheating is exchanging information with other people during an examination.
- One example of plagiarism is submitting parts of others' work in your own name.
- Discovering plagiarism is easier than many people believe, with the help of technical tools.

#### Here are some common forms of plagiarism:

- Students copying wording or ideas from published sources.
- Students copying from other students.
- Students cooperating so much that that their submissions become almost identical.

#### Remember to:

- list your sources when using others' ideas, arguments or results
- learn to read and summarise information from sources
- read, process, rewrite and refer to information from your sources

- is personal and may not be lent to others
- Used for KTH Print



# Your studies!

Course administration process at KTH:

Course selection → Admission → Registration

- You should be admitted to the courses that you have selected before you came to KTH. Check your pages.
- For changes/updates contact your coordinator!
- No later than 9<sup>th</sup> of September!

Some courses may be difficult to join at a later stage, e.g. project based courses.

# **Course registration**

Register for your courses as soon as possible!

- confirms that you will take your courses
- shall be done before each new course starts
- is necessary for you to access the course in Canvas and to get results reported
- necessary for student card

Register for the course in the service Ladok for students:

- under the tab "Services" in the Personal menu, or on the page **student.ladok.se**.

Course registration periods:

Period 1: 25th of August to 5th of September

Period 2: 27th of October to 7th of November



# The personal menu (my pages) and Canvas

The personal menu at kth.se gives you access to various essential services online, such as:

- your schedule
- your KTH email
- the programme web
- Canvas
- Ladok for students
- Issuing your transcript

**Canvas** is KTH's learning platform for all courses.

There you will:

- get access to course materials and read course memos
- · carry out assignments
- · keep in touch with teachers and other students

# Register for exams!

- If you are going to have a written exam, you must register for it via Ladok for students.
- Application to the examination is to be done 2 weeks prior to the exam period.
- Always bring your Photo-ID to the exam (passport/National ID)
- Written exams scanned to your pages



# T-number/temporary registration number/personnummer

- Your T-number consist of your date of birth, the letter T and three digits (YYMMDD-TXXX).
- T-number is only used by KTH, the Student Union and student housing queue.
- Use this when being in contact with KTH. It is stated on your pages.
- On your pages!
