





Stockholm

- Stockholm is known as one of the world's most inclusive cities. The urban appeal is balanced with centuries-old history and closeness to nature.
- Stockholm was founded in the 13th century. With 2.4 million inhabitants, it is the heart of Swedish trade and business life.
- The city spreads across a Baltic Sea archipelago of fourteen islands. Stockholm is easy to get around on foot or public transport, and its various districts have their own unique vibes.
- The weather changes according to four distinct seasons. Summers are warm and it rarely gets dark during nights. The winters may be mild and rainy but can also be quite cold and snowy. The colours of autumn are spectacular, and spring is welcomed by locals, wrapped in blankets at outdoor restaurants and cafés.





KTH and technological advances

- Since its start in 1827, KTH has been at the centre of many technological advances in Sweden.
- KTH is now ranked as number 73 in the QS ranking.
- The refrigerator, nuclear power and mobile phones are some examples of technology that has changed everyday life for all of us and shows how KTH's researchers and students have influenced the development of society.












The academic year and examination

The academic year

- The academic year is divided into two semesters of twenty weeks each.
- Each semester is divided into two study periods.
- At the end of each study period there will be time for own work and an examination period

Examination

- Some courses have written or oral exams, in other courses you will be examined through an assignment or project assignment.
- If you are going to have a written exam, you must register for it via Ladok for students.
- KTH has exam periods in the end of each study period. If you miss or fail the exam, KTH
 gives a re-examination period a couple of months later.

KTH has five campuses spread around Stockholm. KTH Campus is located in central Stockholm, while KTH's other campus areas are strategically located close to industry and research.



The personal menu


Log in to kth.se to access the personal menu. This is your entry point to your studies with links to your schedule, your courses, your programme and important services such as Ladok for students (e.g. course registration, exam registration).





Register for the course

- Before each new course starts, you need to make a course registration.
- A course registration confirms that you will attend the course to which you are admitted.
- Please note, being admitted to a KTH course is not the same as being registered for the course.
- Once you have registered for your course, you will get access to the course room in Canvas and will be able to get results reported.
- For the upcoming study period, you need to register no later than 4 September in Ladok for students.
- You will find it via the Services tab in the Personal menu.







Register for exams!



- If you are going to have a written exam, you must register for it via Ladok for students.
- Application to the examination is to be done 2 weeks prior to the exam period.
- Always bring your Photo-ID to the exam (passport/National ID)
- Written exams will be scanned to your pages



Get your access card

- You will receive your access card during Arrival days, or by visiting KTH Entré at KTH Campus or one of our campuses in Flemingsberg, Kista or Södertälje.
- It gives you access to premises at KTH.
- Your access card is personal and linked to you as a student. You are therefore not allowed to lend out your access card.



- Insurance is stated on your Letter of Acceptance








Student web and newsletter

Course room in Canvas



Cultural Shock and Swedish winter darkness: adjustment to a new environment

Being in a new cultural setting is fun, but can also be challenging! Keep in mind that:

- If you start to feel tired or low, be kind to yourself and reach out to others you are not alone!
- When it starts to get darker in October and onwards, take extra care of your mental health! Stay physically active, and try to spend as much time outdoors as possible in the daylight, preferably before noon
- Read up on mental health and remember that if your biological rhythm is affected by the darkness, remember that it is completely normal! Seek knowledge e.g. by reading information on <u>winter darkness from Karolinska Institute</u>



Compensatory support from Funka

If you have a documented, permanent disability, you can receive compensatory support in your studies at KTH from the support group "Funka". Learn more at **kth.se/en/funka**

Examples of permanent disabilities:

- dyslexia
- physical disabilities
- neuropsychiatric disabilities, such as autism and ADHD
- permanent mental illness


Examples of support:

- longer writing time for exams and partial exams
- help with taking notes
- resources from the KTH Library, such as audiobooks, Braille or e-textbooks.



Student discount card from Mecenat

- A digital Mecenat card will automatically be ordered for you when you have registered for your courses, and you can have it on your smartphone.
- Stockholm Public Transport (SL) provides various means of transport. You are eligible for student discounts on SL, but only after you have received your Mecenat card with a SL-logo. Before that, you have to pay full price.





T-number/temporary registration number (Personal identification number)

- Your T-number consist of your date of birth, the letter T and three digits (YYMMDD-TXXX).
- T-number is only used by KTH, the Student Union and student housing queue.
- Use this when being in contact with KTH. It is stated on your pages.
- On your pages!







Rights and responsibilites

According to the Higher Education Act, students have the right to influence their education. When both students and staff take joint responsibility, the quality of the programme increases.

You can exercise student influence in several different ways:

- fill in course surveys
- become active in your chapters
- submit complaints or comments to KTH (via a form at kth.se/student).

As a student, you also have responsibilities, such as not cheating or plagiarizing. You must also not harass other students or staff.



KTH Code of Conduct

Read the full code of conduct here.

Main points:

All students and staff at KTH have the same rights, opportunities and obligations, regardless of sex, transgender identity or expression, ethnicity, religion or other belief, disability, sexual orientation or age.

Equal treatment at KTH implies a respectful and inclusive work and study environment free from harassment, sexual harassment, discrimination and offensive behaviour.

You are expected to always lead by example and maintain a professional approach to all meetings and in all communication.

Violation of the Code of Conduct may be ground for disciplinary action.

If you feel that you have been discriminated, harassed, sexually harassed or victimized please <u>visit our webpage for information</u> about available support or to file a complaint.



Avoid cheating and plagiarism

- Cheating is when you use unauthorized aids or otherwise try to mislead in a test or similar.
- Plagiarism is when you submit someone else's work in your own name.
- It is easier to detect plagiarism than many people think.
- Common forms of plagiarism include copying wording or ideas from published sources, copying from other students and collaborating so much that the work is almost identical.
- Avoiding plagiarism
 - Cite sources when using other people's ideas, arguments or results.
 - Learn to read and summarise information from sources
 - Read, process, rewrite and reference information from your sources.

Safety during your studies

KTH has a security and crisis organisation to help you feel safe during your studies. Here are some simple general tips:

- Never leave your valuables unattended.
- Do not write your PIN code on your access card and do not lend your card to others.
- Do not let unauthorised people in through locked doors.
- Keep track of escape routes in case the fire alarm goes off. Evacuation plans are available in all buildings.
- In the evenings and nights, security guards perform checks in KTH's buildings, so remember to bring a valid ID document if you are studying late in KTH's premises.
