Intended learning outcomes

After completing this course, students should be able to:

 \cdot demonstrate skill and ability to develop an idea into a complete work of art;

· critically reflect and discuss their own and other's work in an artistic and spatial context;

 \cdot discuss and describe how their own choice of technique, medium, expression, method, and process relate to a given subject; and

 \cdot critically reflect on their own working process and develop an independent approach to making art.

Course contents

Course Description:

This course deepens students' knowledge of artistic approaches in relation to the discipline of architecture. The course objective is to open up, reflect, and make art using alternative perspectives and methods. The focus is on developing and critically reflecting on the process of making art.

The course is divided into two parts.

Examination
