Intended learning outcomes

History of Architecture: Global Perspectives

The course presents approaches to architectural history from global points of view. The traditional Euro-centric culture of architectural history (shaping the field in schools of architecture in most parts of the world) is considered in relation to alternative models. Thematic approaches, period studies and comparative methods are considered through examples dealing with different parts of the world from ancient to early modern.

Course contents

Examination

- MOM1 - Moment, 3.0 credits, grading scale: P, F

Other requirements for final grade
