Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The over all purpose of the course is to offer insights into historical and theoretical aspects of the architectural field.

After finishing the course the student should be able to

- analyse the literature from a critical perspective
- independently find and benefit from literature in the field concerned
- present the results in writing and/or orally.

Course contents

The course is subdivided into parallel series of seminars, where the student enter deeply into one theme within architecture history och architecture theory.

Disposition

Seminars, lectures and individual work within the given field.

Course literature

To be presented at the beginning of the course.

Examination
