Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The overall objective of the course is to give an introduction to Nordic architecture through a combination of lectures and study tours. On completing the course, students shall have a good orientation concerning the specific circumstances under which the towns have developed, and knowledge of the development of the built environment and its character.

Course contents

The course focuses mainly on the architecture from the latest 200 years in the capitals of the North and deals with both town planning and architectural highlights.

Disposition

During the course, two study tours to Nordic capitals are carried out. The tours are preceded by lectures on the history of the towns. During the tours, students conduct individual assignments, which are discussed at a final seminar. The tours take place in connection with weekends.

Course literature

Course literature will be announced at the introduction to the course.

Examination

- MOM1 - Study Tours, 4.0 credits, grading scale: P, F
- MOM2 - Assignments, 2.0 credits, grading scale: P, F

Based on recommendation from KTH's coordinator for disabilities, the examiner will decide how to adapt an examination for students with documented disability.

The examiner may apply another examination format when re-examining individual students.

If the course is discontinued, students may request to be examined during the following two academic years.

Other requirements for final grade

Requirements for the grade passed: 80% presence on lectures and study tours, accepted assignment and participation on final seminar.
