Main field of study

Architecture

Specific prerequisites

The course is intended for students at the Architecture program at KTH

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The course objective is to give a practical and theoretical knowledge of photographic representation. On completing the course, the students shall be able to work independently with photography as a tool for visual communication.

Course contents

The main focus of the course is to learn how to understand and to use photographic techniques. The following issues are introduced: history of photography, photographic techniques, lightning techniques, model photography, architecture photography.

Disposition

The content of the course is taught in the form of lectures, practical exercises led by a teacher and visits to exhibitions. The course includes an individual photographic assignment.

Course literature

To be announced at the introduction to the course.

Examination

- MOM1 - 80% participation on Lectures and Exercises, 3.0 credits, grading scale: P, F
- MOM2 - Assignment, 3.0 credits, grading scale: P, F

Based on recommendation from KTH's coordinator for disabilities, the examiner will decide how to adapt an examination for students with documented disability.

The examiner may apply another examination format when re-examining individual students.

If the course is discontinued, students may request to be examined during the following two academic years.

Other requirements for final grade

To obtain the grade passed, 80% participation on lectures and exercises and accepted assignment is required.

- In an oral assessment, every student shall be able to present and answer questions about the entire assignment and solution.
