# Specific prerequisites

University studies of 60 credits (hp) and Swedish B/Swedish 3 and English A/English 6 or equivalent.

## Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

## Intended learning outcomes

The objective of the course is to give an overview of the reconstruction as a working method within architecture.

After the course, students shall

- have a comprehensive knowledge of the role of reconstruction in old and modern architecture
- be able to analyze reconstructions from a theoretical perspective
- be able to problematize reconstructions from a cultural heritage perspective
- be able to discuss qualitative differences between original and copy

#### Course contents

The course consists of lectures, seminars and literature that deal with the theory and history of architectonic reconstructions from several thematic aspects: museal reconstructions; reconstructions after war and disaster; recreated national or regional monuments; ritual reconstructions; qualitative differences between original and copy.

The course contains obligatory literature, which is examined at the seminars.

The course includes an individual assignment, which consists of a short written essay and an oral presentation at a final seminar.

## Disposition

The course consists of about six whole days at KTH.

#### **Examination**

If the course is discontinued, students may request to be examined during the following two academic years.
