Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The main objective of the course is to provide knowledge of the modern built heritage and the problems connected to its preservation, with a focus on Sweden and Europe. The modern world heritage sites are included in the scope. After the course, the participant should have a good overview of the field's history and theory and be familiar with its key references in the form of buildings, restoration projects, historiography and source texts. The student shall be able to apply this knowledge independently in an individual assignment.

Course contents

The course consists of lectures, text seminars and excursions. An individual assignment is to be reported at the end of the course. The course literature, which contains overviews and source texts, is discussed and examined currently at seminars.

Disposition

The course is scheduled for approximately six whole days at KTH. The course literature is examined currently at seminars. An individual assignment is to be reported at the end of the course.

Specific prerequisites

120 hp högskolestudier.

Dokumenterade kunskaper i Svenska B/Svenska 3 och engelska A/Engelska 6 eller motsvarande.

Examination

- MOM1 - Lectures and seminars, 5.0 credits, grading scale: P, F
- MOM2 - Assignment, 2.5 credits, grading scale: P, F

Based on recommendation from KTH's coordinator for disabilities, the examiner will decide how to adapt an examination for students with documented disability.

The examiner may apply another examination format when re-examining individual students.

Other requirements for final grade

The course contains 2 moments, MOM1 and MOM2. For final grade, both moments have to be passed, and 80% attendance at all tuition is required.

- In an oral assessment, every student shall be able to present and answer questions about the entire assignment and solution.
