Intended learning outcomes

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

- Describe typical construction equipment and techniques used in bituminous highway pavement construction.
- Illustrate familiarity with typical road maintenance techniques.
- Understand about specifications and quality assurance/quality control techniques used in bituminous pavement construction.

Course contents

- Introduction to highway construction, maintenance, and road management
- Serviceability/performance concepts for hot mix asphalt pavements
- Distresses in hot mix asphalt pavements
- Asphalt mixture types
- Hot mix asphalt plant and transportation operations
- Asphalt plant and hauling issues, including segregation
- Asphalt pavers, and mixture factors affecting compaction
- Compaction equipment, and field conditions which affect compaction
- Rolling patterns
- Types of density specifications used for hot mix asphalt construction
- Measurement of density
- Bidding methods
- Specification development
- Sampling
- Quality control/quality assurance
- Preventive maintenance
- Patching mixtures
- Selection of materials for pavement maintenance
- Corrective maintenance
- Rehabilitation
- Reconstruction
- Engineering services and estimation of quantities
- Maintenance of low volume roads
