Intended learning outcomes

Learning outcomes for the participants after completion of the course are to:

- Demonstrate the ability to relate theoretical macroeconomic models to policy issues
- Show a broad knowledge of the subject macroeconomics
- Using macroeconomic theory and empirical data to generate decision support
- Individually and together with other analyze, reason and communicate on issues related to macroeconomic variables both in writing and verbally
- Selecting appropriate macroeconomic models and empirical methods for analyzing macroeconomic phenomena
- Show an ability to reflect on how economic shocks affect aggregate economic performance in the short and long term

Course contents

How macroeconomic variables are interrelated

- Exchange rates, deflation, inflation, prices and inflation
- Focus on empirical macroeconomics
- Technology development, innovation, competitiveness and growth
- International trade, direct investment and globalization
- Monetary and fiscal policy
- Financial markets, labor and product market
- Compile, analyze and report on macroeconomic data orally and in writing
