Specific prerequisites

For students not registered on a KTH programme (180hp/300hp):

- completed upper secondary education including documented proficiency in English (IELTS, TOEFL et al) and university studies of at least 120 hp out of which 30 hp in Economics or Business Administration.

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The course has specific goals. After completing the course you should be able to:

- Describe the foundations of value theory.
- Describe the methods of valuation that are used, both from a theoretical and practical perspective.
- Describe the differences and similarities between valuation of different type of objects, for instance condominium and woodlands.
- Describe valuation when dealing with expropriation and environment damage.
- Comprehensive description of how market analysis are performed, and how market information are gathered and used in a context of real estate valuation.
- Do valuation of detached house and condominium and present conclusions in a written report performed in an academic way. (Project 1).
- Perform an valuation opinion of a real estate with normal characteristics (Project 2).
- Describe the foundations of real estate taxation.

Course contents

A review of central parts of the subject real estate valuation.

Course literature

Main textbook: Fastighetsnomenklaturen, Institutet för värdering av fastigheter i Stockholm och Fastighetsnytt förlag, Stockholm.

A specially written compendium with articles on other topics.

Examination
