Specific prerequisites

Completed upper secondary education including documented proficiency in Swedish corresponding to Swedish B and English corresponding to English A. For students who received/will receive their final school grades after 31 december 2009, there are additional entry requirements as follows: Mathematics D, Science B or Physics A and Chemistry A.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The objective of the course is to describe different theories within the field of organizational science and leadership, in other words, theories of individual behaviour within the organization, group behaviour, decision-making, handling of conflicts, and organizational structure, organizational culture and organizational change and theories of leadership.

Another objective of the course is to explain how theories of organizations and leadership can be integrated in a specific situation.

Students should be able to use theories, models and concepts within organizations in the real estate and financial sector.

Furthermore, students should be able to identify possible causes for different performances of individuals, groups and corporations.

Students should also be able to develop suggestions on how to improve the performance of individuals, groups and corporations based on theories of leadership and organizations and analyze the pros and cons with these suggestions.
