Specific prerequisites

Completed upper secondary education including documented proficiency in Swedish corresponding to Swedish B and English corresponding to English A. Specific requirements of mathematics, physics and chemistry (or natural science) corresponding to: Mathematics D, Physics A and Chemistry A. Physics A and Chemistry A can be replaced by Natural Science B.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

After the course a student should be able to:

- Explain the function, financing and management of the real estate market.
- Describe the financial sector, the financial system and the role of the financial markets in the planning and building process in society.
- Explain how the legal system and laws affect different actors within the real estate sector and the financial system.
- Explain how different actors perceive development of cities and society and the different tradeoffs that they are considering.
- Find and use different sources of information for the written assignment.
- Write a well-structured and informative essay and orally present the results.

Course contents

The course is an introduction to a number of important areas within real estate and finance; the role and function of the financial system, the real estate market, economics and capital investment appraisal.

The students will get practical experience of collecting and analyzing information in a scientific correct way in writing a written report.
