Economics (AI1107) or Economics of the Built Environment (AI1128) and Organization and Management (AI1125), Investment analysis (AI1108) or equivalent knowledge.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The basic aim of the course is to provide knowledge about the appropriate methods and analytical tools requisite for management of rental housing and commercial properties.

After a fully completed course you should be able to:

- Explain the concept of property management
- Analyse various financial ratios as a basis for diagnosis and prognosis in property management
- Explain the similarities and differences in the management of various property
- Explain the principles underlying the rent formation process in the rental market
- Perform an economic analysis of different types of rental contracts and activities
- Prepare simplified short-term property management plans

Course contents

This is an applied course in property management with a focus on specific governance of individual property units. The course aims at providing the tools necessary to analyze ownership of rental housing and commercial properties based on a property management perspective. In addition to the above, the students will be made familiar with the latest research in the property management field.
