Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The basic aim of the course is to give an understanding of principles and methods for management of rental housing and commercial property.

After the course you should be able to:

- Explain what is included in the concept of property management.
- Perform a profitability analysis on a renovation project
- Make technical maintenance plans
- Analyze different types of rental contracts from a financial perspective
- Estimate the renovation needs of an existing building
- Indicate various applications of sustainability principles in real estate management
- Explain how ethical considerations form part of the property management business

Course contents

An applied course in property management with specific governance on each property unit. The course aims at providing the tools necessary to manage housing and commercial properties. The theoretical knowledge in technical and financial property management is applied in the project work where the students make a qualified analysis of an existing property. In addition to the above, the students will be made familiar with the latest research in the property management field.

The teaching will in a systematic way show the important links between the content of the course and legal- and technical issues.
