Information requirements. Duty of disclosure. Jointly owned facilities. Real property. Personal property. Easement. Property register. Property. Co-operative apartments. Marketing legislation. Good marketing practice. Liabilities of damages. Commission. Vicarious liability. Liability insurance. Personal liability. Discrimination act. Money laundering. Supervision authority. Real estate agency associations.
