Intended learning outcomes

The purpose of this course is to provide deeper studies in civil and public law concerning real estate.

Course contents

The Code of Land Laws. Real Estate and their borders. Attachments to land. Legal Relationship between neighbours. Purchase, Exchange and Gift. Effects of Blame. Right of Pledges. Tenancy, Rent, Site-leasehold Rights, Right of Use. Easement, Custom, Preference because of Registration, Credulous Acquisition. Legal Ratification of Real Estate, mortgage and registration of rights.

Execution with important rules about Real Estate in the Act of priority rights, the Act of enforcement, the Act of Bankruptcy and Auction of Real Estate.

Rules about jointly owned property; and influence on Real Estate Law from Family Law and European Law.
