Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

After having taken the course the student shall have basic knowledge of the legal order, the division into legal subjects and legal concepts, about legal methods and basic proficiency in solving legal problems. The course deals with several areas of law, for example European Community law, public law, the law of contracts, property law, and the private law of real property.

After having taken the course the student shall be able to:

- * Identify basic legal problems and find the applicable legal rules in the areas of law covered by the course.
- * Apply the relevant legal rules when solving basic legal problems in the areas of law covered by the course, and to explain the reasons for the application of the rules to the problem.

Course contents

The course begins with a lecture and a workshop that focuses on the legal order and legal methods, as a basis for the studies of the different areas of law. The different areas are then covered one by one.

Disposition

As a general rule there is a lecture and a workshop that deals with one area of law each week. During the course the student shall write a one or more summaries of relevant court cases. The cases are discussed at one of the workshops. There is a written examination at the end of the course.
