Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The overall aim is to provide knowledge of the regulatory regime for changes of real properties/real property division and how the interaction between real properties occurs. After the completion of the course the student should be able to:

- Describe the use of regulations that deal with changes of real properties/ real property division, land-related rights and cooperation between real properties
- Identify and evaluate different legal solutions to practical problems related to real property division and connecting rights and cooperation between real properties
- Apply relevant legislation when solving legal problems related to changes of real property division and connecting rights and cooperation between real properties

Course contents

The course covers law related to real property and connecting land use legislation, joint facilities and certain rights connected to real properties. It also deals with expropriation law and compensation issues on an overview basis. The course is designed to provide a thorough survey of the regulatory structure and legislative provisions.
