Specific prerequisites

Planning, Building and Environmental Law in Property Development (AI1520) and Law (AI1519) or equivalent knowledge.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The overall aim of the course is to provide students with knowledge and understanding of how existing real property and property right structures, as well as previous urban development, affect the current conditions of property development.

This means that students after completing the course are expected to be able to:

- Describe how the current land use, infrastructure and urban settlement have emerged.
- Analyze how existing conditions affect alternative building designs in the future.

Course contents

Urban historical development to the present, with respect to planning, building design, architecture, infrastructure and property rights. The link between urban development and property rights in particular will be illustrated from a historical perspective. This also relates to planning, housing and land policy development in the context of social changes in society.
