Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to provide a deeper knowledge about legal rules and procedures connected to planning and implementation of complex infrastructure projects.

The course participators should be able to apply existing rules as well as account for their legal design from a critical perspective.

Course contents

Lectures and tutorials are combined and related to a project exercise regarding a genuine infrastructure project. The course deals with several main themes:

System perspective

- Theoretical foundations of planning- and concession systems, and distribution systems regarding common facilities
- Legal coordination between different regulations
- International conventions and EU law

Permissibility procedures

- Legal rules and procedures connected to complex alterations of land use, e.g. roads, railways, water and sewage constructions, cables and pipelines for different purposes

Distribution of responsibility

- Methods for co-operation

The responsibility for constructing, managing and financing common facilities.

Will be announced at the beginning of the course.

Examination
