## Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

## Intended learning outcomes

The course aims to provide the students with insights in the value adding activities in all phases of a building project and especially how those can be realized in the construction phase. After finishing the course the students should be prepared to take part and manage the conceptual development of a project and to organize and manage construction processes from client briefs and design to production and maintenance.

## Course contents

Two parallel processes are studied in the course. The first process is the project development process: how to analyse needs and market, find and develop the building site, manage legal conditions and financing, define and design the actual building, purchase the production, marketing, find customers/investors. The second process is the production process: planning, preparation, manufacturing, purchasing, delivery and assembly. The intricate and strategic relationship between those two processes are studied with focus on the project management mission.
