Intended learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to provide knowledge about concepts, tools and methods for project communication. After completing the course, the participants should be able to:

- Describe, use and compare concepts within project communication.
- Select, use and evaluate tools and methods in project communication for analysis.
- Describe and explain obstacles and opportunities for the client to contribute to more sustainable construction process and built environment.
- Relate to and apply previous knowledge in the area.

Course contents

The course includes: The construction process, planning, project management, the client role, project organization. contract forms, stakeholder management, information management and communication.

Examination
