Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to prepare students for further studies on advanced level within real estate and construction, as well as for analysing the planning- and construction process and for participating in and managing construction projects.

After completing the course, the participants should be able to:

Describe, use, select and compare concepts, tools and methods for analysis of the planning and construction process and for planning and managing construction projects, especially from the client's perspective, based on established research, considering goals for sustainable development.

Course contents

The course includes the planning and construction process, project management, the client role, project organization, contract forms, stakeholder management, information management and communication.

Examination

- PRO2 - Project Work, 2.5 credits, grading scale: P, F
- ÖVN2 - Essay, 5.0 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F
