Intended learning outcomes

After completion of the course the student shall have

Knowledge and understanding to:

- Explain the basic concepts of the different types of cell structures and organization
- Explain basic concepts regarding structure and function of proteins, nucleic acids, lipids and carbohydrates
- Describe common metabolic pathways

Course contents

The course aims to provide basic-level theoretical knowledge in biochemistry and an introduction to biotechnology. Much of the course focuses on the cell's macromolecules proteins, lipids, nucleic acids and carbohydrates and their building blocks and interactions in metabolism, photosynthesis and gene technology.

The course consists of the following parts:

- Prokaryotic and eukaryotic cells' structure and organization Membranes' structure and function
- Nucleic acids' structure, biosynthesis and function in the cell's transfer of information
- Protein structure, function and biosynthesis
- Enzymes' catalytic function and role in metabolism
- The most important (glycolysis, gluconeogenesis, citric acid cycle) metabolic pathways' structure, function, interaction and regulation
- Energy balance in aerobic and anaerobic conditions
- Biotechnical tools and applications

Examination
