Specific prerequisites

Moved up to school year 4 of an engineering programme, or admitted to a Master's (120 credits) programme.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student should be able to account for the different subareas of the media law as well as the relation between media law and integrity statement and freedom of information. The student should be able to account for media law contract conditions as well as the relation between Swedish, European and international media law. Further, the student should be trained to analyse and solve media law questions actively.

Course contents

The main aim of the course is to teach the students to use the media law system that protects the media production, that is intellectual property law, marketing law, protection of privacy, and freedom of speech and information.

During the course, the students will go through and work with relevant legal literature, law texts and legal cases.

The industrial connection is achieved by basing all components of the course on situations where media companies may use the media law system in the media production.
