Listening comprehension

• understand the content of clear standard speech on general subject areas/events (level B2)

Reading comprehension

• assimilate the content of letters and written information of various types and from different sources (level B2/C1)

Speaking

- converse and discuss informally on topics of personal interest or related to studies, work or topical events. (level B1)
- orally summarise texts of a general nature (level B1/B2)

Writing

• produce short essays and texts (level B1/B2)

Course contents

- Insight into the culture of German-speaking countries focusing on intercultural differences
- Practice expressing oneself orally and in writing in response to practical situations abroad
- Information about language use in German-speaking countries
- Practice in understanding and conversation
- Optional tandem practice with German-speaking students
- Study visit
