## Specific prerequisites

General entrance requirements for university studies with 1-2 years' study of Japanese or equivalent and **a compulsory placement test before applying** or a pass in elementary Japanese, DS1380 eller DS1381. See our website for the test and more information.

Students on the programmes with Japanese international profile have priority to the course.

## Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

## Intended learning outcomes

EU language portfolio levels A1/B1, <http://europass.cedefop.europa.eu/>

### After the course, the student should be able to:

- use the spoken and written language in simple everyday situations (level A1)
- understand and give an accurate account (in Swedish) of information from different elementary texts
- give a short, individually prepared oral presentation in the target language (level A2/B1)
- use an ideogram dictionary to find unfamiliar ideograms
- translate simple sentences from Japanese to Swedish and vice versa.

## Course contents

- Practice in understanding and speaking Japanese in everyday situations
- Pronunciation and intonation
- Grammar and vocabulary. 70 kanji-characters
- Practice translation of simple texts from Japanese to Swedish and vice versa
- Writing exercises, for example letters and simple everyday notes

## Disposition

56 lessons divided into 28 sessions x 2 lessons during the academic year (periods 1-4).

## Examination

- ANN1 - Oral Proficiency, 1.5 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F
- KONA - Test, 1.5 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F
- TEN1 - Language Proficiency, 3.0 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F

Based on recommendation from KTH's coordinator for disabilities, the examiner will decide how to adapt an examination for students with documented disability.

The examiner may apply another examination format when re-examining individual students.

## Other requirements for final grade

75% attendance. Oral proficiency (ANN1; 1,5 credits) mid-term tests (KONA; 1,5 credits) and written final examination (TEN1; 3 credits).
