Intended learning outcomes

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- speak and write the language in everyday situations and simple workplace situations
- understand and distinguish the main content of clear standard speech on familiar topics
- use the spoken language in everyday situations when talking about well-known topics
- write texts, for example thank you letters or requests
- identify and give an account of facts from simple texts with some connection to specialised topics.

Course contents

- Reading and oral skills in a variety of situations
- Pronunciation practice
- Grammar and vocabulary
- Learning of another 120 kanji-characters and an introduction to technical terminology
- Translation exercises of everyday texts as well as simple technical texts with computer support from Japanese to Swedish and vice versa
- Writing exercises, CV

56 lessons divided into 28 sessions x 2 lessons during the academic year (periods 1-4).

Examination

- KON1 - Assignments, 3.0 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F
- ANN1 - Language Proficiency, 3.0 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F
- TEN1 - Examination, 3.0 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F

Based on recommendation from KTH's coordinator for disabilities, the examiner will decide how to adapt an examination for students with documented disability.

The examiner may apply another examination format when re-examining individual students.

If the course is discontinued, students may request to be examined during the following two academic years.

Other requirements for final grade

75% attendance. Oral and written examinations (KON1; 3 credits and ANN1; 3 credits), final examination (TEN1; 3 credits)
