Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

After completing the course, the student will be able to:

- describe historical and contemporary development in the field of planning theory
- identify, explain and use central concepts from planning theory
- discuss the relation between theory and methodology
- discuss and evaluate the use and value of theory in relation to planning practice
- critically analyse theoretical texts and place them in a wider context of theoretical traditions
- position and relate own research to relevant strands of the wider historical context of planning theory and planning research

Course contents

The course is based on individual readings of selected texts of the different strands in planning theory, as a base for discussions and exercises at the seminars. The students are expected to throughout the course write notes on how their own subject and research relates to the readings. The examination consist of participation in the seminars, and an elaborated text, positioning the research in the tradition of planning theory and research. The text should be written as a part of the theoretical section in a dissertation, and the subject will decide theoretical concepts and authors used in each individual final examination.
