Participants will also become familiar with policies and requirements for master theses at STH.

- What can be expected by a master thesis supervisor at STH?
- What can be expected by a master thesis student at STH?
- Strategies for efficient supervision

Disposition

1. Lecture
2. Seminars with PhD-students and senior faculty
3. Seminar only for PhD students

Examination
