Intended learning outcomes

After completion of the course students will be able

- to describe and explain the role of logistics and substance in companies and the society
- structured to identify and describe the essential logistics related terms and activities in the logistics process
- to describe and handle aspects on warehousing, inbound logistics, and outbound distribution, within logistics effectiveness.

Course contents

- Basic logistics concepts are presented and analyzed
- The various components of the logistics process will be introduced and analyzed
- Different logistics tools useful in change management are reviewed and explained

Disposition

Lectures, seminars, at times study visits, and project work. 6 occasions. The course is given on half-time in the daytime and in Swedish, but is not a distance-course with distance tuition.

Specific prerequisites

University studies of at least 120 credits (Swedish hp) and documented proficiency in Swedish B and English A, or equivalent.

Examination
