Specific prerequisites

University studies of at least 120 credits (Swedish hp) and documented proficiency in Swedish B and English A, or equivalent.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

- Good awareness of the role and substance of purchasing and supply management in companies, public authorities, and government agencies.
- In a structured way be able to identify and describe essential purchasing-related terms and activities within the purchasing process.
- Be able to describe and explain aspects on the supplier-base design related to purchase needs, supplier relations, and sourcing strategies.

Course contents

Strategic and operational purchasing matters, supplier base design, buyer-supplier relations, supplier selection; the purchasing role in the supplier chain.

Disposition

Lectures, seminars, at times study visits, and project work. 6 occasions. The course is given on half-time in the daytime and in Swedish, but is not a distance-course with distance tuition.
