Language of instruction

Intended learning outcomes

This course will give the participants further knowledge in how different decisions about manage and structure influence the total costs and the delivery services of a producing company.

Course contents

In this course manage and design of logistic structures will be described. This is a large area, and the course will focus on the most usual issues. That means for example different supply strategies and how they are connected with different production strategies. This will be illustrated by a game. Different concepts such as VMI (vendor managed inventory) will be discussed in a seminar. Even the problem of managing several companies in a chain is presented in a game (Beer Game).
