Main field of study

Specific prerequisites

Since this is a spring semester (semester 2) study course in the degree of master programme TPLVM one needs to have at least 10 ECTS credits from the autumn semester (semester 1) study courses in order to be registered and thus start the course. To take it as a single course one needs to be eligible to the program and not admitted to the programme.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

After finishing the study course the participants should be able to:

- Define the team's development stage by using the FIRO model
- Handle non-complying opinions in the team
- Introduce new members to the team and make it perform to standard
- Cooperate with sponsor in order to ensure the effectiveness of the team
- Handle conflicts and collaboration
- Implement team work

Course contents

Managing oneself and managing projects as part of leadership is discussed and shown in the study course which is using experienced based pedagogical methods. Also included is the affect the organisation will have on the team and its development including the culture of the base organisation.

A vital part is development of communication patterns in complex systems and the obstacles of implementation.
