Intended learning outcomes

To give the participant knowledge about how practical leadership is performed utilizing a management system. Leading is not only being charismatic and convincing. It is to its largest extent creating routines and instructions anchored in the Business Strategy and made pedagogical and clear for the personnel to use in the day-to-day work.

The best system for this would be the management system originally developed for quality control but today extended far beyond only that part. To learn how to administer and use this system for business control is the aim of this block.

Course contents

Short brush up of knowledge in quality and the basic quality tools. Understanding complexity, since the management system is an intelligent reduction of the holistic approach to organisational management and leadership. How to administer a management system. Understanding processes and how to manage the white spaces in the organisation chart. Using results from statistics and data catch (see practical Statistics HM2004). How to use visualization for practical instructions. Self-governing groups within the management system.
