When the course is passed the student is expected to:

- Realize valuations of small houses and tenant-owner flats
- Have good understanding of valuating commercial estates and block of flats
- Realize analysis of the real estate market and private properties
- Have knowledge to reach information through official files connected to the Swedish real estates
- Have an understanding of regulations for leases for commercial estates
- Have an understanding about property taxation

#### Course contents

Valuation of real estates with fundamental market analysis of the same as well as single objects.
