Intended learning outcomes

After the course, the participants will be able to:

- Construct and solve an advanced short term calculation with free capacity including two variables (products) and several constraints
- Write out and implement different kinds of cost allocations methods
- Construct models for investment decisions: Net Present Value, Annuity, and Internal Rate of Return
- Carry out a cost variance calculation
- Solve a computer aided linear model for optimizing, so-called Linear Programming
- Choose and justify for when different types of calculations are appropriate

Course contents

The course contains two parts, Mostly traditional theory, and also some exercises. Even though the theory is traditional, the economic exercises and the surrounding references are held familiar for an engineer. The exercises are computer aided in Microsoft Excel.
