Intended learning outcomes

After the course the participant is expected to have achieved the following skills:

- Through analysis of own group work and reflection of own performance during the course, be able to show insights and understanding of how groups and individuals develop according to the presented group – and individual development theories
- Describe an increased awareness about own controlling values and its consequences in own behavior
- Through analysis of own and group member's practice of leadership show insight in what is typical for Situational Leadership.
- Be able to describe different organization models and draw conclusions about their application
- Be able to describe the demands an efficient and functioning change is putting on management

Examination
