Specific prerequisites

The course is primarily directed to teachers at KTH.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the course participant should be able to

- * account for how expected learning outcomes, grading criteria and examination stick together,
- * formulate criterion-referenced grading criteria for a course,
- * suggest how items of the examination should be designed so that they assess according to the grading criteria,
- * review critically grading criteria,
- * account for different ways to combine grades to a final grade and which effects these can give.

Course contents

Positive effects of criterion-referenced grading criteria.

Genuine examples of how grading criteria have been formulated and been used in courses at KTH and Uppsala University.

Examination
