Intended learning outcomes

- Manage (refer to) references found in text
- By analysis or synthesis use the texts retrieved to: Pursue an argument, compare and apply different models on problem formulations
- Use sources found to establish a theoretical basis, on which a student's own studies can be based (compare with theoretical background in articles)
- Efficiently read and understand scientific literature

Course contents

The student will learn to use the results of a collection of information in a creative way and create literature studies or theoretical backgrounds to, for example, degree projects.
