Intended learning outcomes

The expected learning outcomes for the course correspond mainly to levels B1 of CEFR, the Common European Framework of Reference for Language.

On completion of the course, the student should be able to:

Listening comprehension

- understand the contents of clear standard speech about subjects of personal interest or within his/her academic field
- understand informative speech when clearly spoken

Reading comprehension

• understand and give a correct description of authentic, scientific or technical texts

Speech and interaction

- deliver a speech and develop its main ideas as part of a longer discussion
- communicate facts about familiar topics effectively
- summarise texts of a general and/or specialised nature
- deliver a formal individual presentation

Writing

- understand and demonstrate the difference between informal and formal language
- summarise texts of a general and/or specialised nature
- write short technical descriptions

Course contents

Overview and practice of English grammar. Vocabulary for Engineering and Science students. Reading and discussion of short texts of a scientific or technical nature. Conversations in small groups and before a larger group. Preparing for and delivering a formal individual presentation. Technical writing. Listening comprehension exercise and discussion.
