Specific prerequisites

General university entry requirements. Completed and passed Japanese A1, an equivalent course or the equivalent knowledge shown through a compulsory placement test made before applying for the course.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The expected learning outcomes for the course are mainly at the level A2 according to CEFR, Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

On completion of the course, in addition to what is evident from courses at a lower level, the student should be able to:

- use the language orally and in writing in everyday situations and simple work situations
- understand and distinguish the main contents of clear standard speech about well-known topics
- discuss about known subjects in everyday situations
- write texts such as letters to express thanks or wish
- identify facts from simple texts with technical content

Course contents

Exercises to understand Japanese and build conversations of your own in various situations. Pronunciation exercises. Grammar and vocabulary exercises. Further learning of about 120 kanji signs. Overview of the structure of technical terms. Translation exercises of everyday and simple technical texts from Japanese to Swedish and vice-versa. Written exercises like questionnaires and CVs. Facts about Japan, Japanese culture, society and technical development.

Examination

- DELA - Assignment, 1.5 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F
- TENB - Written Language Proficiency, 3.0 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F
- TENA - Oral Language Proficiency, 3.0 credits, grading scale: A, B, C, D, E, FX, F
- KONA - Assessment, 1.5 credits, grading scale: P, F
