Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to give the participants training in oral communication in Swedish workplace context and an introduction to and understanding of Swedish company culture.

After passing the course, the student should be able to:

- describe what is characteristic for Swedish company culture
- identify cultural clashes that can arise on inter-cultural workplaces
- analyse and explain workplace related conflicts and tensions

Course contents

In an engaging and enjoyable manner, we discuss some concrete examples of what is characterising for the Swedish company culture, such as the law of Jante, the consensus philosophy, the hierarchy perception and working models.

Examination

• INL1 - Assessment, 1.5 credits, grading scale: P, F
