Specific prerequisites

Student must follow a programme for engineering at KTH and have a finished and passed course in Industrial Economics at KTH-Indek.

Exemption for those students in program CMATD, who have read the course MH1021 in autumn 2009 or 2010.

Language of instruction

The language of instruction is specified in the course offering information in the course catalogue.

Intended learning outcomes

The aim is to give theoretical insights and practical methods in the area of quotations and negotiations.

After the course you should be able to:

- Be able to make a quotation (in the Swedish language) with references to standard agreements.
- Be able to make a PowerPoint-presentation (in the Swedish language) of the quotation including photos and movie-clips, which have been edited.
- Be able to evaluate the economic outcome from an investment, which saves personnel.
- Be able to carry out (in the Swedish language) a negotiation successfully, with help from various tools.
- Be able to conclude (in the Swedish language) the meeting after the successful negotiation.

Course contents

The course consists of lectures regarding such topics as i.e. negotiation techniques and tender presentations. The course also consists of compulsory trainings in form of role-plays.

Course literature

Compendium for the course and for literature given when the course starts.

Examination

- TEN1 - Examination, 3.0 credits, grading scale: P, F
